



## Strategy Framework 2019-2024 Priorities

- *Facilitating collaboration between all stakeholders*
  - Providing a platform for discussion
  - Creating and strengthening channels of communication between interested parties
  - Building links between users, ensuring no single user dominates
  - Creating and strengthening wider networks of shared interests
- *Information gathering and sharing*
  - Creating a reliable forum where information relating to Shad Thames can be fed in, shared and investigated
- *Conservation Area Management Plan*
  - Monitoring and rigorous enforcement
  - Will run until 2024; informal annual reviews until then
- *CIL (Community Infrastructure Levy) and S106 contributions*
  - Working with Ward Councillors to ensure funds generated in Shad Thames are spent here on projects supported by local stakeholders
- *Relationships:*
  - *At senior level of Southwark Council* (including Planning; Conservation; Strategic Director of Place and Well-Being; appropriate Cabinet members)
  - *With partners for new and established commercial developments* (including TBC; The Dixon Hotel/Dominvs; Courage Yard, now owned by Southwark Council)
  - *With significant local businesses* (including D&D restaurants; Zoopla)
  - *With key local partners nearby* (including Team London Bridge; Tower Bridge; Bermondsey Street London; Better Bankside)
  - *With other significant authorities/agencies* (including PLA [Port of London Authority]; Corporation of London (planning, enforcement and other relevant departments); GLA; TfL)
  - *With cultural organisations* (including Illuminated River; Zaha Hadid Foundation; London Festival of Architecture; Totally Thames Festival; Illuminate Rotherhithe (Mayflower 400) )
  - *With organisations that focus on architecture and the built environment* (including Place Alliance; Historic England)
- *Placemaking: strengthening identity of, and sense of community within, Shad Thames*
  - Shad Thames events (working with STRA)
  - *Shad Thames Trail* and related activities
  - Active in Friends of Butlers Wharf Riverside (led by Emma Sanderson Nash)
  - Partnering with Team London Bridge on Cultural Strategy

- *Shad Thames businesses*
  - Renewing efforts to establish a Shad Thames Business Network
  - Continuing to explore options for formal/informal/hybrid partnership with Team London Bridge
  
- *Fundraising*
  - To cover basic STAMP costs and administrative assistance
  - For specific initiatives which help implement priorities
  
- *Servicing and deliveries: traffic reduction*
  - Supported by Ward Councillors and STRA
  
- *Infrastructure projects, including Streets Project*
  - Supported by Ward Councillors and STRA
  
- *Clarifying role in relation to all stakeholders, so as to complement (and not duplicate) the work done by Ward Councillors and STRA on behalf of residents, in particular in the following areas:*
  - Licensing
  - Planning
  - Liaison with Police
  - Street cleaning and domestic waste collection
  - Noise
